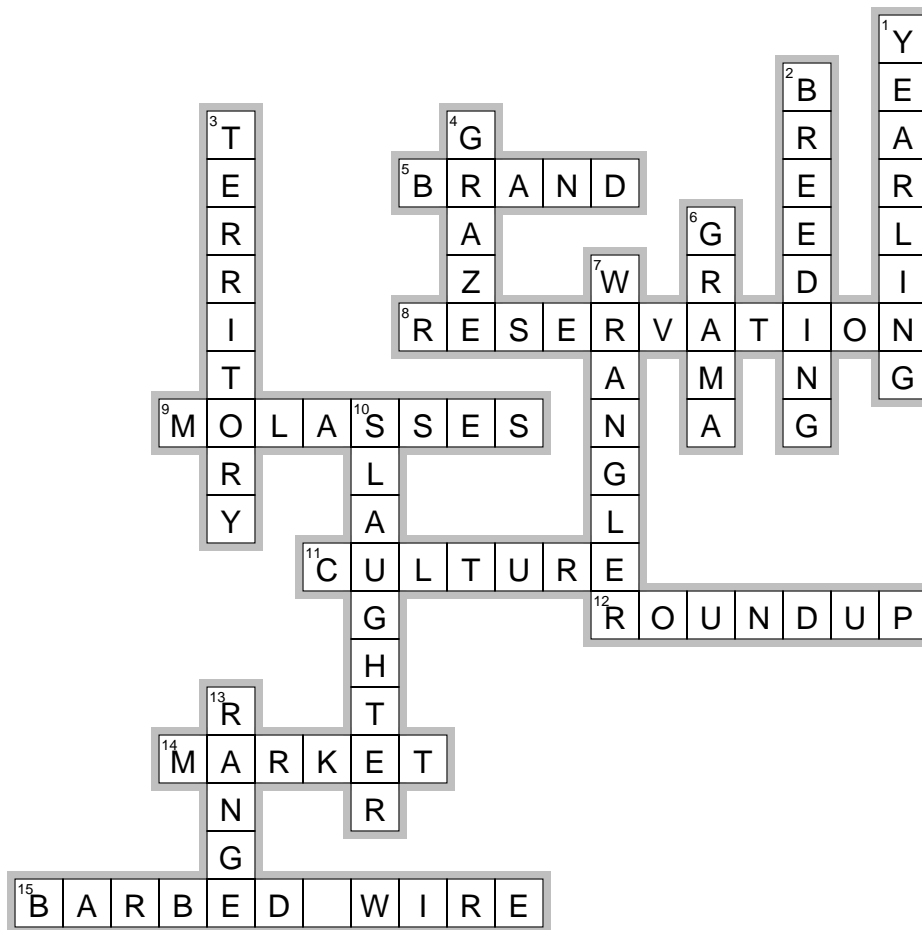


Dakota Pathways: A History - #18

5. BRAND — a mark made by burning with a hot iron to attest manufacture or quality or to designate ownership
8. RESERVATION — a tract of land set apart by the federal government for a special purpose, especially one for the use of a Native American people.
9. MOLASSES — the thick dark to light brown syrup that is separated from raw sugar in sugar manufacture
11. CULTURE — the integrated pattern of human knowledge, belief, and behavior that depends upon man's capacity for learning and transmitting knowledge to succeeding generations
12. ROUNDUP — the act or process of collecting animals (as cattle) by riding around them and driving them in
14. MARKET — a geographical area of demand for commodities or services
15. BARBED WIRE — twisted wires armed with barbs or sharp points-called also barbwire

1. YEARNING — an animal one year old or in the second year of its age
2. BREEDING — to propagate (plants or animals) sexually and usually under controlled conditions
3. TERRITORY — a geographical area belonging to or under the jurisdiction of a governmental authority
4. GRAZE — to feed on growing herbage, attached algae, or phytoplankton
6. GRAMA — any of several pasture grasses (genus *Bouteloua*) of the western U.S.
7. WRANGLER — a ranch hand who takes care of the saddle horses; broadly: cowboy
10. SLAUGHTER — the act of killing; specifically: the butchering of livestock for market
13. RANGE — an open region over which animals (as livestock) may roam and feed
