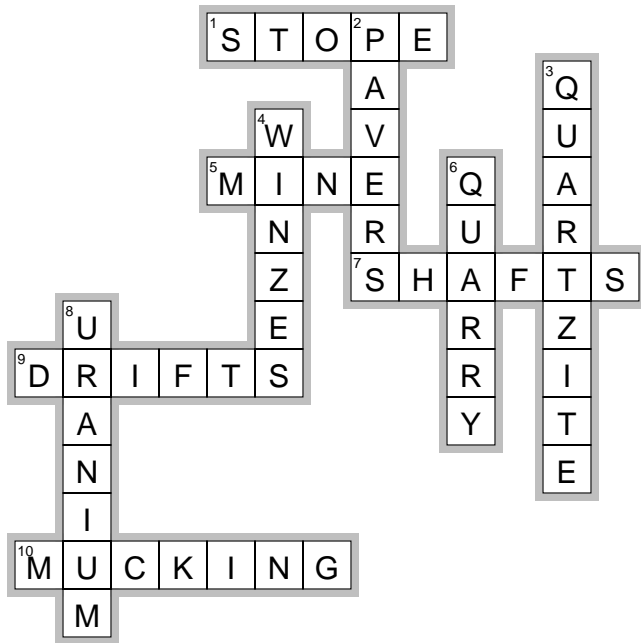


# Dakota Pathways

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## Across

1. STOPE — The place where the rock was blasted and loaded
5. MINE — To get (as ore) from the earth
7. SHAFTS — Passages that went up and down, in mines, if they went clear to the surface
9. DRIFTS — The tunnels that miners blasted
10. MUCKING — The hard work of loading the rock after it had been blasted

## Down

2. PAVERS — Pieces of quartzite cut smooth and narrow and fit together to create a smooth surface for city streets
3. QUARTZITE — Super hard, pink stone, used in the construction of buildings and streets in the late 1800s
4. WINZES — Passages that went up and down, in mines, that did NOT go to the surface
6. QUARRY — A mine that is open to the sky, without underground tunnels
8. URANIUM — Used to fuel nuclear power plants responsible for producing electricity, in the 1950s
